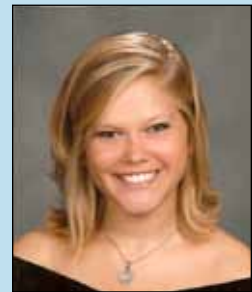

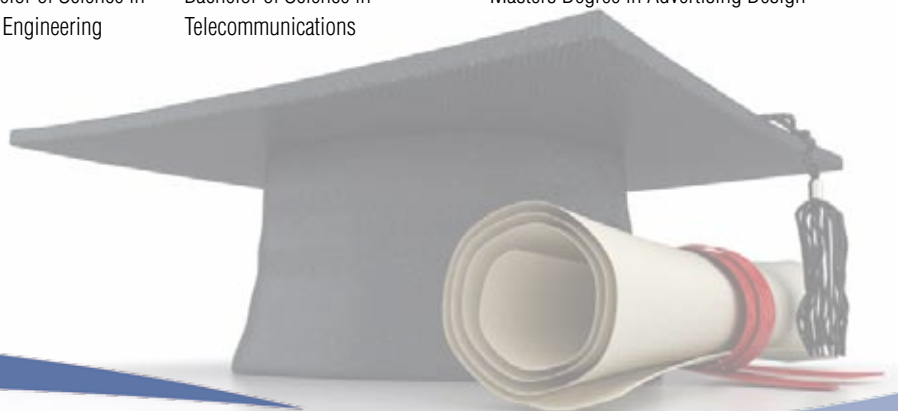

# God Will Satisfy Every Need



*"And my God will fully satisfy every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4: 19)*

These were Paul's words of encouragement and hope, offered to the church at Philippi. "...God will fully satisfy every need..." How truthful this statement has been for our congregation these last several weeks and months. God has provided in positive ways we could have never expected!

Have you noticed how active our congregation has been in the work of ministry lately? Even in the midst of recession and economic difficulties, God has enabled our people to be active and fully engaged in the work of the Gospel. I want to take just a few simple lines of this article to point to areas of service and ministry that have been growing and developing, because of God's Imaginative Providence!

- **An Invigorated Ministry for Children and Youth!** Months ago, when many groups were shuffling and relocating spaces, it was the open-minded imagination of Tammy Pugh who suggested the children might occupy the newly vacated "Aspire Wing." Shortly thereafter, a very generous gift from a CPBC family made it possible to fund a renewal project in that part of our facilities. Then Lucas Dorion, with the help of the Children's Advisory Council and many other volunteers spent countless hours painting and renewing the space for what has become a first rate Children's Wing. Additionally, we have seen the launch of "SHIFT" an afterschool program on Thursday afternoons for Middle Schoolers in our community. The program, which is designed to give students a safe place to gather one day a week, will eventually provide services such as free music lessons through the CPBC School of Music and free tutoring through our up and coming Center for Life Transitions. All of the funding for this program is underwritten because of a grant Lucas Dorion was able to write and secure from one of the Mayor's city-wide initiatives. Even in lean economic times, God's imaginative providence will "...fully satisfy every need...!"
- **Renewal comes to our Chapel facilities!** A little more than a year ago now, CPBC received a \$21,000 grant for the purpose of developing a new and ongoing missional initiative in our community. It was the vision of Bill Dick and the *Acts 2 Initiative Steering Committee* to create a space within our church facilities dedicated to the ministry of helping people in our community through a wide variety of human transitions (joblessness, employment training, English literacy, support groups, Financial Peace University, etc.). As a result of the funds secured through this grant, our chapel area is under renovation! Mark Ostroth and Mark Mikesell have been working diligently to upgrade that space. In addition, our Properties Committee and numerous volunteers have put in time and energy

to make sure this area is prepped for optimal missional use! And God's imaginative providence continues to "...fully satisfy every need...!"

- **Easter Experiment a huge success!** Almost a year ago, Lucas Dorion and Debbie Hairel began celebrating the idea of a "multi-generational" missions experience for the entire church. The result was the *Easter Experiment*, a week-long mission-immersion in our city. Many served on construction sites, some served meals at Ronald McDonald Houses, some worked at Grand Ave Elementary, others sorted clothes at Kid's Closet, and many prayed through the week. The EE was a huge success. One of the added delights? The majority of all construction costs (paint, lumber, supplies, etc.) were covered by a grant Lucas Dorion was able to secure from the city to help in projects such as these. And in creative ways "...God will fully satisfy every need..."
- **Cooler air returns to the third floor!** If you are in one of the three adult Sunday school classes meeting on the third floor above the offices, you will notice much more agreeable temperatures in the hotter months. How? Because of the anonymous generosity of persons within our congregation who contributed financially toward seeing the problem fixed! This happens because the imaginative providence of God moves within the hearts of people "...fully satisfying every need..."
- **New Centers a Class Act!** Have you noticed the two new centers in our halls? Our *Missions Center* is located directly outside the sanctuary and is the gathering place after every worship service where you and your family can get more deeply involved in the missions of our church. The *Welcome Center* is located in the heart of the church, next to the Fellowship Hall elevator, as a gathering spot for our guests to gather valuable information about CPBC. Both of these centers have been skillfully hand crafted by Lee Stallings, whose abilities you well know, and are visible reminders of God's imaginative provision "...satisfying every need..."
- **New Trees add Color and Life!** In an effort to honor the memory of his beloved spouse Marjorie Gore, Jack asked if it would be possible for him to fund the planting of a tree on our campus. In speaking with another member, Doug Jones at *Ever Growing Trees*, he was moved and delighted, saying, "if he pays for one, I'll put in two!" So, now you will see on Sunday, two young *Tabebuia ipes*, a.k.a. "Pink Trumpet" trees beside Yale St. As God "...satisfies every need..."

I could go on for pages, listing the innumerable and hidden ways members within our congregation give and sacrifice and share all the time, for the good of our church. We need to know what activity that is when it happens. It is nothing short of the imaginative providence of God, working through the hearts of people. Thanks be to God!

It was a cold, cold winter... even brutal in some areas. Before the hot, hot, "dog days of summer" arrive, one final reminder from winter may help us get a handle on stewardship.

Now, we all know the basics of snowflakes... there are never two exactly alike. (I have often wondered who had enough time to figure that one out, but I will let it pass for now!) We also know that when they are put together they can form a beautiful snowman, a snow ball, or even a "snow fort." Not much stewardship in that... or is there?

Years ago churches collected their tithes and offerings in different ways. Many Baptist congregations had a system not a great deal unlike Dave Ramsey's envelope program for managing your budget. Each week the individual would put their offering in the "Pastor Salary" envelope, or the "Utilities" envelope or maybe the "Benevolence" envelope. That could be dangerous if the pastor had a run-in with a member or the sermon was just not great.

Then, thankfully, along came the "Unified Budget" approach. That is, all the tithes and offerings are pooled together and all of the bills and obligations get taken care of systematically and, hopefully, cohesively.

The principle behind the "Unified Budget" is in reality the principle of the snowflake. One snowflake can do little... in fact, if it just sits there by itself it will melt—no snowman, no snow fort, and no snow ball... just a wet spot on the ground. But, when joined with other snowflakes it can become as creative as the mind can imagine.

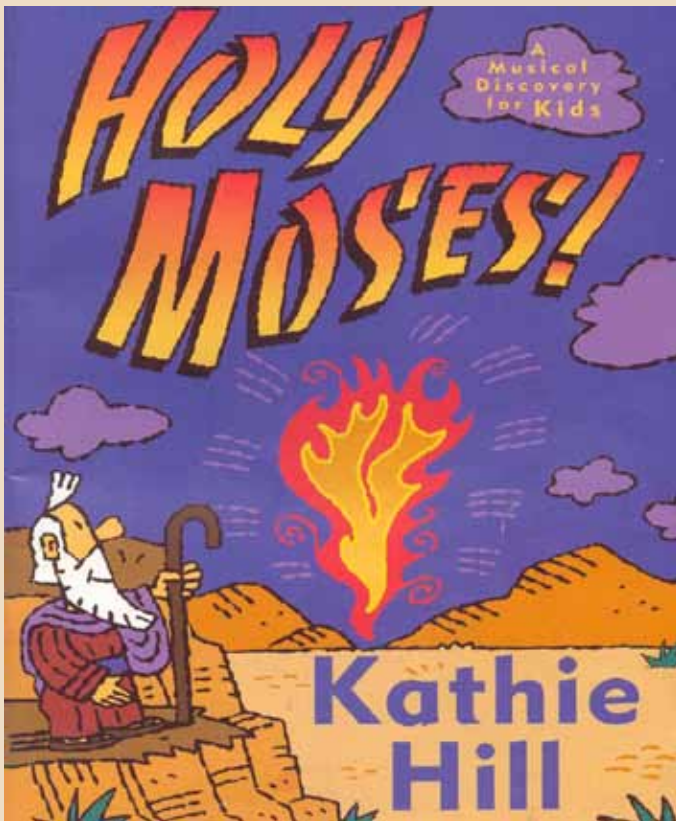
Next month, CPBC will begin its "Unified Budget" process for the coming year. Every individual and family participating in this process will enable the "envisioned possibilities" to become realities by combining their gifts (snowflakes) with those of others to form a "snowperson" (staff?), a snow fort (missions?), or a snowball (ministries?). Perhaps being "one in the spirit" is not just a touchy-feely kind of thing... it is wise stewardship.

Sing with me: "Let it snow, let it snow, let it snow!"

Think about it.
