Stewardship:

A lesson from Baseball

Post “baby-boomers” have probably had precious little exposure to the great comics of the early 20th century like Laurel and Hardy and Abbott and Costello...that’s their loss! One of the classic routines from these slapstick “hilariteers” of yesteryear is Abbott and Costello’s “Who’s on first?” Bud Abbott tries, unsuccessfully, to explain to Costello the strange names of the players on the local team: “Who,” “What,” “I Don’t Care,” etc. For those who would like to relive the experience, or maybe catch it for the first time, you can find it at:

Costello’s incessant plea, “Who’s on first?” has become a byword for priorities in numerous areas of life: when differences of opinion delay a decision...”who’s on first?” When questions must be pushed up the chain of command...”who’s on first?” And so forth.

So where does stewardship come in? I am glad you asked. When Paul praises the church at Corinth for their great spirit of generosity, even to the point of actually giving “beyond what they really had,” he pinpoints the origin of their liberality: they gave only after they had “first given themselves to God” (2 Cor. 8:5). For those gracious Christians it was easy to answer “Who’s on first?” It was God.

Do we truly believe that all things come from God, that He is the owner of all that we have, and we are caretakers, or stewards, of what He has placed into our possession? If so, then the real question is not must I tithe or how much should I give. The relevant question becomes “who’s on first?” We will invest our time, money, and skills in that which has priority in our life. That priority is just another way of affirming “who’s on first?”

Now before we start asking “what” I should do now (he’s on second), or “I don’t know” where to start (he’s on third), or “why” should I tithe (he’s in left field), let’s just answer the main question: “Who is on first?”

HEART OF WORSHIP



I hope you and those close to you were able to participate in our recent Worship Renewal Weekend at College Park Baptist. We were extremely blessed to have, as our guest leader, Kyle Matthews.

On Friday Kyle led us through a churchwide, congregational dialogue on the essence and character of authentic Christian worship. The discussion took shape in two parts, separated by a short break. In part one, Kyle suggested that in recent years, when it has come to worship planning, many churches have tragically limited the conversation by merely talking about "style." Traditional...Contemporary...Back-to-back services (one of each style)...Blended...and so on. In the first half of our Friday dialogue, Kyle drew insights from our church members about the presumptive benefits and pitfalls of each one of these various styles. There are strengths and weaknesses in all our many "worship ways." But one of the important insights that came out of our first session is worth reflection. When we discuss worship primarily in terms of "style" only, we miss what is most important. At the heart of worship, it is not a matter of style, or personal taste. It is about something higher, wider, and far deeper.

That's why in the second part of our discussion, Kyle asked a very foundational question. "If you could only use one word to describe what worship must include, in order for it to truly be 'worship' for you, what would that be?" The following words came from those of you who were present in the room. You said, "worship must include:

Praise...Connection...Inspirational...Reverent...Relative... Relevant...Freedom...Confession...Joy... Fellowship... Meaningfulness...Searching... Questioning... Music... Loving...Scripture...Prayer... Missional...Participatory... Order... Spontaneous...Expectancy...Depth... Call-to-Action... Immersion... Litany...Transforming...Powerful... Tranquil... Silence..."

After stepping back to look at the whiteboard with all these words, it was observed how none of these requirements or prerequisites are "style-oriented" answers. They are all deeper and

firmer than style only. How wonderful! These are the kinds of worship-values that your staff considers when prayerfully organizing our worship ways here at College Park Baptist.

That is why I am eager to share a new sermon series with you, entitled "**Heart of Worship.**" We will take the next six Sundays to fully engage the true essence and character of worship. We are going beyond the typical discussion of style into the deeper and more substantive issues such as developing and cultivating a worshipful lifestyle that goes beyond Sunday. Here are a few of the topics we will be addressing:

Sept. 5th *When God Looks over All God Has Made, Genesis 6*

Have you ever considered what happens in the heart of God, when God's people worship? Come, see what Noah and his family have to say about the matter.

Sept. 12th *Worship, Consumerism, and the Fleecing of the Church, John 2 and 4*

Want to see Jesus pitch a fit? Come watch him in the temple, and see what the "table-tossing" is all about.

Sept. 19th *One Bread, One Cup, One Table, One Body, Ephesians 4; Acts 2, and Philippians 2*

Is it really possible for 5 generations to worship in the same room? At the same time? Come see why it's not only possible, but non-negotiable.

Sept. 26th *Reasonable Worship, Romans 12:1-2*

The Apostle Paul seems to think worship is not so much about Sunday as much as it is about every day. Seems reasonable to him. What about you? Come discover the joy of a daily rhythm of worship.

October 3rd *When Good Worship Falls on Deaf Ears, Amos 5, Micah 3:6; James 1:22-25*

Ever wonder what God considers "good worship?" Come discover what turns God's head, and what turns God's stomach.

Oct. 10th *Earth, Crammed with Heaven, Revelation 4*

Looking for a higher plane than you have found? Come plant your feet on higher ground.

Come, let us WORSHIP and bow down!
