

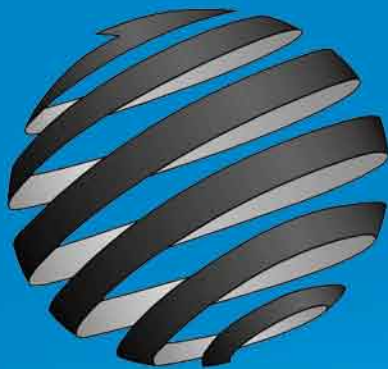

There are separate activities for children, youth, and college students. Childcare is available for birth – 4-year-olds.

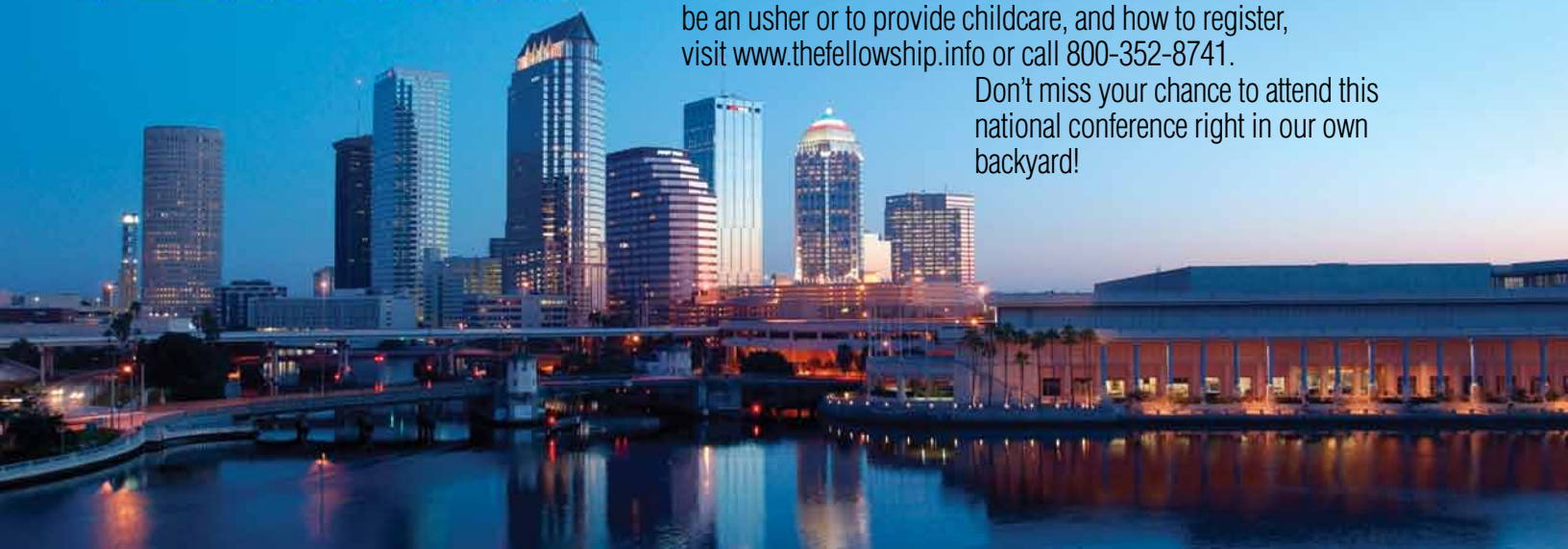
Register for the Anniversary Party on Wednesday, June 22, and hear Molly Marshall speak and Ken Medema provide music.

College Park Baptist is a unique congregation for many reasons. One of those reasons is our identity as a Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF) congregation. Our affiliation with the CBF moves far beyond a partnership in name only. From its inception the CBF has grown and become strengthened because of congregations like CPBC who were willing, and remain willing, to carry the banner of historic Baptist principles such as Soul Freedom, Church Freedom, Bible Freedom and Religious Freedom.

Inherent in these freedoms, we find the core values that Baptists have championed for over 400 years. Values such as: *soul competency* (the belief that each individual is free and responsible to commune with God, read and interpret scripture, and order life in a way prompted by the Spirit of Christ which dwells within); *the priesthood of all believers* (the belief that we stand before God with no need of intermediary, and that we are our own priests, and priests to one another in a shared community of Christly love); and local church autonomy (the belief that churches are free and responsible to read and interpret scripture, select its own leadership; and decide on matters of church business in prayerful discernment with one another before God.).

Why the Baptist Theology review? Because these are the values and principles that unify this congregation to so many within the wider CBF community. All over the world we will find CBF congregations of great diversity. Some aging, some budding. Some urban, some rural. Some casual, some formal. But all who share in common these values that must be nurtured intentionally, cultivated frequently and celebrated vigorously!

That is why the CBF General Assembly in Tampa, June 22-25 is such a big deal. Once each year, CBF Churches and individuals gather, not only to celebrate the values we hold dear, but to engage and re-engage in the fruitful

dialogue that will ensure there is a freedom-loving, Baptist voice and presence for each new generation within Christ's Church. While there are auxiliary sessions and workshops prior to and after The Assembly, the primary activities of the General Assembly will be held on Thursday and Friday (June 23-24). During these two days there will be transformative worship services, inspiring messages, stimulating workshops and breakout sessions, and a general rekindling of the spirit.

In addition, College Park Baptist will be playing a vital role in the celebration, in several ways. We are providing childcare and programming for preschool children, we are participating in the 20th Anniversary Mass Choir, and we have also been asked to make a brief presentation in one of the General Sessions regarding our experience with the Advent Conspiracy and the sense of renewed missional generosity it produced within us last year. There are many reasons to make plans now to attend.

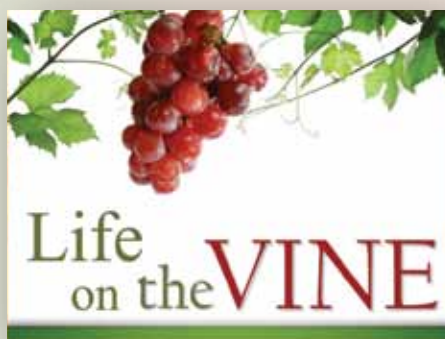
In the coming weeks you will receive even more detailed information regarding the kinds of workshops and sessions that are available. In the
