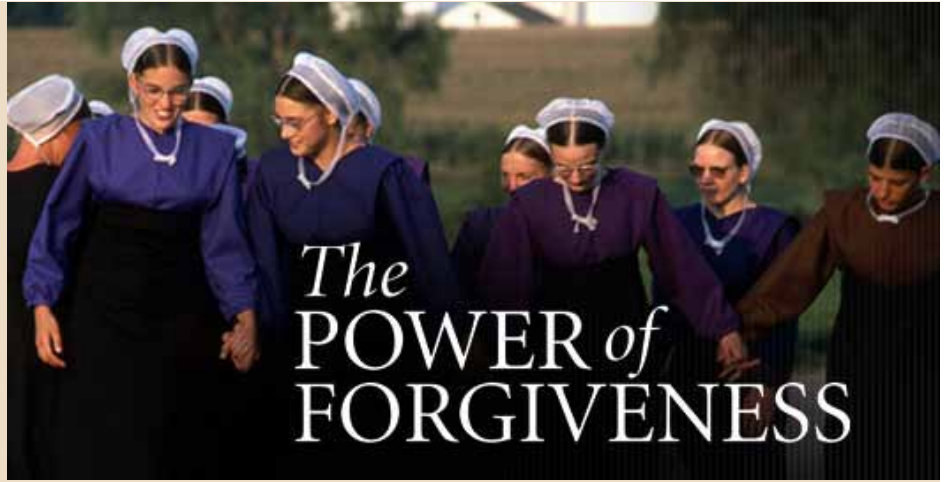

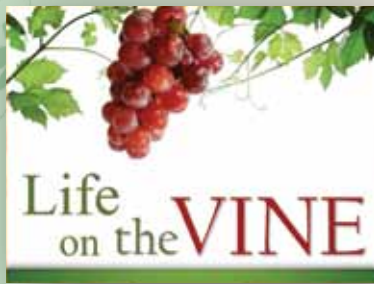
Fall Semester for CPBC School of Music

Why The Social Media Blitz?



So, why the social media blitz?

Two words: Gutenberg Press.

It was around the year 1440 in Mainz, Germany, when Johannes Gutenberg unveiled his new invention. It was a printing press with moveable type. For the first time in history, it was now possible to mass produce information, papers, & books. In a single day, one Gutenberg press could print 3,600 pages, compared to a meager 40 pages on the existing press. But the real impact of this new invention could not have been imagined by Gutenberg, nor by any of his contemporaries. The possibility of printing at such a robust and expeditious way literally infused within the masses of Europe an empowerment that had never before been known. The great social wall of literacy was now being dismantled. Peasants and commoners were now informed, connected, and equipped in various struggles for freedom and significance. Now with a voice, they were empowered to rise to a new level of knowing, existing, and being. It is precisely the invention of the Gutenberg press that laid the foundation for the Protestant Reformation. Now, the bold teachings (and writings) of Luther, Zwingli, Calvin, and others gave voice to the silent consciences of the masses. Gutenberg's invention ushered in much more than simple convenience. It ushered in a new social paradigm. A new way of seeing and engaging and being oriented as a human being in the world. It re-defined what it meant to be in community with others who may not live in your village, but whose struggles put them in solidarity with you. So significant was the impact of Gutenberg's invention that in 1620, the English statesman and philosopher Francis Bacon wrote that this form of printing has "changed the whole face and state of things throughout the world."

That's big.

So is the advent of social media. Nothing since Gutenberg has had quite the same impact. Oh wait. The telegraph connected continents, I suppose. Thank you, Mr. Morse. And I guess the telephone is here to stay too. Yes, that does ring a Bell. Good idea Alexander. Then there is radio and TV with a bit of an impact as well, wouldn't you say? Yes. Over the centuries we have seen inventions that have helped improve our lives, shape our way of

relating, communicating, and engaging with one another. But few can compete with the impact that is still unfolding in regard to the advent of social media.

Social networks such as Facebook and Twitter are not only wildly popular and growing, they are beginning to impact (once again) how we live, breath, and have our being. A new paradigm shift is underway. The definition of community is being broadened (not at all unlike that of Gutenberg's era). So much so that later this month, there will be a massive conference in Atlanta called, "From Gutenberg to Zuckerberg." That's Mark Zuckerberg, the inventor of Facebook. The conference will focus on the impact of social media on our culture and on the church! From Gutenberg to Zuckerberg, the church has always been most alive when she has been willing to engage the shifting cultural paradigms in the effort to be a steady presence and bold witness to the uncompromising message of God's immense love.

That's why.

That's why the blitz. That's why the effort to become engaged, present, and relevant in the exciting new community being shaped, tweeted, and posted around us. Because, in the end, to be missional in the 21st century means the same thing it meant in the 1st. It means we will go wherever the gospel message compels and propels. Today, that message insists that the church go into this new frontier, this perhaps foreign field, where still the "grain is ripe unto harvest."
